Many Kenyans, particularly Gen Z, feel that current political parties do not align with their values, highlighting a significant gap that could pave the way for a new political movement.

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Voting Intent in 2027

Q. Do you plan to vote in the next general elections in 2027?



The majority of the population, 87%, translating to ~19 million people, plan to vote in the 2027 elections, a significant increase from the 65% or ~14 million who voted in 2022. This shift indicates that Kenyans recognize the significant impact elected officials have on their lives and are more determined to influence who assumes leadership roles.

Although most Kenyans prefer a new candidate, President William Ruto has the strongest support among older generations, while Fred Matiang'i leads among Gen Z and Millennials.

Its worthy to note that none of the candidates currently have enough support to secure a victory in an election.

The term "someone new" didn't always imply an unfamiliar figure. Although the responses were varied, Uhuru Kenyatta, Kasmuel McOure, and Jimi Wanjigi were the most frequently mentioned. This suggests that the favored "new" candidates are well-known figures who are popular but publicly anti-establishment.

If an election were held today, governors in 22 counties would likely be defeated. Joshua Irungu, Amos Nyaribo, Nathif Jama Adam, and Benjamin Cheboi are the most at risk of losing their positions.
